The Technique:

The process separates the X and Y sperm by filtering the husband's sperm through increasingly thicker concentrations of human serum albumin. The enriched sperm sample is then used for insemination when ovulation is anticipated. The separation process selects out the most optimal sperm for insemination and leaves behind slower moving sperm and debris found in semen. This highly technical process takes up to four hours and is performed in our lab. Our technicians have all been personally trained by Dr. Ronald Ericsson.

Success

The success for bearing a male baby using this procedure is approximately 75% to 80%. The chance of bearing a female baby is around 70% to 73%. The sperm isolation process cannot completely separate X sperm from Y sperm. Therefore, there is no 100% guarantee. This method has resulted in hundreds of healthy babies being born in the United States and worldwide.
